How to Approach Multiple Choice Questions

1) Be sure to read any INSTRUCTIONS carefully before answering.

a. Trick - Are you to answer on the sheet? On Scantron?

2) READ THE ENTIRE QUESTION before looking at the answer choices.

- a. Trick Know what is being asked.
- b. Trick Cover the answers.
- c. Trick Anticipate the answer while reading the question, anticipate what the answer might be.

3) READ all the ANSWER choices.

- a. Trick Review ALL the answers on the page.
- b. Trick If the answer you anticipated is one of the answers, consider it the correct answer.

4) Determine what the question is asking by identifying KEY WORDS in the question.

- a. Trick Underline all of the key words.
- b. Trick Look up any words you don't know.
- c. Trick Read within the context of what is happening in the sentence to figure out the meaning.

5) ELIMINATE DISTRACTORS (incorrect answers) that are designed to lead you away from the correct answer.

- a. Trick Sometimes they are obvious, other times they are not.
- b. Trick Actually cross out the potential answers that don't make sense.
- c. Trick Cross out funny answers.

6) Use the PROCESS OF ELIMINATION method to select the correct answer.

- a. Trick Rule out the answers that you know cannot be correct before marking your answer on the answer sheet.
- b. Trick Cover up the answers you have already eliminated so you only see those to choose from.

7) REFER BACK TO THE TEXT to ensure that you pick the correct answer.

- a. Trick Double check your understanding of what you read.
- 8) If you are asked to give THE BEST MEANING of a word "as used in" the selection, refer to the context in which the words appears to find the answer.
 - a. Trick Look up the word in the dictionary.
 - b. Trick Some words have different meanings (for example there, their, they're or to, too, two). The meaning changes depending on the context.

9) Choose the answer THAT MAKES THE MOST SENSE.

- a. Trick Once you have eliminated the obviously wrong answers, choose the answer that makes the most sense.
- b. Trick If more than one choice seems to answer the question to a certain degree, choose the one which seems to be most correct.
